12 February 2025




Opening Prayer

O God,

you know us to be set
in the midst of so many and great dangers,
that by reason of the frailty of our nature
we cannot always stand upright:
grant to us such strength and protection
as may support us in all dangers
and carry us through all temptations;
through Jesus Christ your Son our Lord,
who is alive and reigns with you,
in the unity of the Holy Spirit,
one God, now and for ever.

Chant I Singt dem Herrn (Sing to God with joyful hearts. Praise the Lord for evermore, praise the Lord for evermore.)



Psalm 138

I will give thanks to you, O Lord, with my whole heart;

before the gods will I sing praise to you. I will bow down towards your holy temple and praise your name,

because of your love and faithfulness; for you have glorified your name and your word above all things. In the day that I called to you, you answered me;

you put new strength in my soul.

All the kings of the earth shall praise you, O Lord.

for they have heard the words of your mouth.

They shall sing of the ways of the Lord, that great is the glory of the Lord. Though the Lord be high, he watches over

the lowly;

as for the proud, he regards them from afar.

Chant 2 Oculi nostri (Our eyes are turned to the Lord Jesus Christ. — Our eyes are turned to the Lord God, our Savior)




Reading Luke 5.1-11

While Jesus was standing beside the lake of Gennesaret, and the crowd was pressing in on him to hear the word of God, he saw two boats there at the shore of the lake; the fishermen had gone out of them and were washing their nets. He got into one of the boats, the one belonging to Simon, and asked him to put out a little way from the shore. Then he sat down and taught the crowds from the boat. When he had finished speaking, he said to Simon, 'Put out into the deep water and let down your nets for a catch.' Simon answered, 'Master, we have worked all night long but have caught nothing. Yet if you say so, I will let down the nets.' When they had done this, they caught so many fish that their nets were beginning to break. So they signalled to their partners in the other boat to come and help them. And they came and filled both boats, so that they began to sink. But when Simon Peter saw it, he fell down at Jesus' knees, saying, 'Go away from me, Lord, for I am a sinful man!' For he and all who were with him were amazed at the catch of fish that they had taken; and so also were James and John, sons of Zebedee, who were partners with Simon. Then Jesus said to Simon, 'Do not be afraid; from now on you will be catching people.' When they had brought their boats to shore, they left everything and followed him.

Taizé at All Hallows

Taizé is a short service using prayer, chants and silence. It is easy to learn, simple and very beautiful. This form of worship takes its name from a town in southern Burgundy, France, which is the home of an international ecumenical Christian community of over a hundred brothers. Regular times of prayer, chants and silence are at the heart of daily life in Taizé, and thousands from many countries have travelled there to experience this form of prayer and reflection. The profound simplicity and beauty of the worship is now used in services around the world, inspired by the ideals of justice and reconciliation that unite the community and those who visit it.

Electoral Roll

Every 6 years a new Electoral Roll of each Parish must be prepared, which is taking place this year. Being on the Electoral Roll gives you the right to vote at the Annual Parochial Church Council, and to stand for as Churchwarden, or for the PCC or Deanery Synod. The number of people on the Electoral Roll also determines the size of the PCC and the number Deanery Synod Representatives a parish can have.

Lent Course

This year we will be joining the **Diocesan Lent Course - Climate Justice & Discipleship.** Across 5 sessions, each led by a different bishop from across the Diocese, we are invited to reflect on five significant moments in Jesus' life and ministry. As we take this journey together, how might we encounter Christ through creation, pursue justice from within, and convert our fearful reactions into a loving response?

They will take place online on the Tuesdays during Lent, 7.30-8.30pm (March 11th, 18th, 25th, April 1st, 8th). If you are unable to make the Tuesday sessions, they will be recorded and available for catch up during the week.
